Habitat 2019 Trip Recap

A team of 10 youth and adults made our annual pilgrimage to Garrett County in Western Maryland July 14 through 19 to help build homes in partnership with Habitat for Humanity. Habitat provides a "hand-up", not a "hand-out". Each Habitat home is sold, not given, to a qualified applicant. Habitat makes no profit on the sale of the home and does not charge interest on the mortgage loan. To help keep costs down, Habitat builds modestly sized homes, using volunteer labor where possible.



This year, we continued our work in the Hopeland Village area, a development southeast of Oakland, MD where we've been working for at least five years. On this trip, most of our group spent the week installing vinyl siding on an entire house. The rest of us worked to install flooring in the living area, laundry/utility room, and closets of several other homes. We will probably continue our work in the Hopeland Village for another year or two while the last few homes are built out.

In addition to other qualifications, each homeowner applicant must perform 250 hours of "sweat equity" per adult in the household. This year we met two applicants at opposite ends of their "sweat equity" requirements. One applicant was just starting her hours during our visit, while the other was performing the last of her hours on the final day of our trip. Hopefully, when we return next year, we will see these two families in the homes we worked on this year.
